ing of the Saratoga, equal in length to 80 stories and carrying a crew of 3,500, sustained damage to its upper hull and a catwalk. The fire, which resulted from a broken fuel line, was quickly put out.

The seas were calm and the weather clear at the time of the collision.

The Navy said the Saratoga was proceeding to Norfolk for repairs and the German ship had requested permission to proceed to Baltimore.

The Leonhardt lost radio contact after the collision and had to flash signals to the Navy de-

stroyer Stribling which relayed them to the Norfolk. The 6,135-ton German vessel, whose home port is Hamburg, left Rotterdam May 3 and was en route to Puerto Ordaz.

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
