Cardinals Win In Pony League Opener, 9 To 3

Scoring eight runs in the second inning, the Decatur Cardinals opened their 1960 Pony League season Wednesday evening with a 9-3 victory over Geneva at the Geneva diamond.

Geneva took a quick lead with a run in the first inning on two walks, an error and a wild pitch. But the Cardinals combined five hits with two walks, a fielder's choice and a wild pitch for eight in the second. Ed Minch, Greg Ladd, Dave Anspaugh and Dan Lose all singled, and Willie Putteet climaxed the rally with a triple.

Geneva picked up single runs in each of the third and fourth innings, and the Cardinals closed out the scoring with one in the fifth on three walks and a single by Terry Conrad.

Summer Program At Adams Central

Amzie Miller, Adams Central high school coach and also director of summer recreation for the community, has announced recreation plans for the summer.

The Monroe Pony League team began play this week, and the Adams Central Little League will open next Monday, with both major and minor league divisions.

The summer afternoon program will start Monday, June 13, and be in operation until Friday, Aug. 12.

The afternoon program, the gym will be open Mondays from 1:30 to 3 o'clock for ping pong, badminton, volleyball and shuffleboard. Tuesdays, from 1:30 to 3, there will be Little League and Pony League practice on the school field, for boys aged 8 to 14. Wednesdays, from 1:30 to 3, there will be basketball practice for all of this year's 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grade boys. This will be the only activity in the gym and all prospective basketball players are urged to be present. Miller will be the instructor.
