### Indiana Reservoir Is Dedicated Today

ROCKVILLE, Ind. (UPI)—Governor Handley said today that states "should have the right at all times to exercise their own judgment as to whether they believe it to be in the best interest of their citizens to accept federal funds."

Speaking at the dedication of the six million dollar Mansfield Reservoir, a flood control project authorized by Congress 22 years ago, Handley said "every level of government has a task to do" in water resources projects.

"We have always recognized the importance of working with the federal government where such broad scope is involved for the prevention of flood devastations and the building up of water resources generally," he said. "We recognize, in fact, that the federal government has an obligation of long standing to finance and help to create such regional projects as this."

"The federal laws which foster and guide such water resources programs all over the nation are ideal examples of efficient federal-state relationships. They provide that projects built by the Army Corps of Engineers with funds voted by the Congress first must receive approval from the governor of the state in which they are proposed before final designs and actual construction can be started."

"This recognizes the partnership of the states and the federal government in this conservation effort (and) helps to maintain the solid balance between the states and the federal services which our wise forefathers envisioned."

"We here in Indiana are proud of the progress being made in water resources activities."

Ecuador President Claims Victory QUITO, Ecuador (UPI)—Three-time President Jose M. Velasco Ibarra claimed victory early today in his fourth race for the presidency on the strength of returns giving him a lead of nearly 2 to 1 over his nearest opponent.

Returns representing about 50 per cent of the total gave Velasco 193,721 votes to 102,436 for U.S.-educated ex-presidential candidate Gonzalo Cordero Crespo and 22,380 for Communist-Socialist nominee Antonio Parra Velasco.
