## BOOK REVIEW

"The Cost of Discipleship," by Dietrich Bonhoeffer, The Macmillan Company, reissued in a revised edition, first published in 1945 and the first of the author's books to appear in English, depicts the author's experiences as a brave Christian witness in perilous times, and his influence on the many people with whom he came in contact. The author, who was hanged by the Nazis in 1945, illustrates the cost by which discipleship, in all nations, may be won.
