## Scholastic Honor To Two County Students

LAFAYETTE, Ind. — Eighty-seven students made a scholastic index of "6," the highest possible mark under the grading system, in their work at Purdue University in the second semester of the 1959-60 academic year, according to the list announced by the office of the registrar. An additional 585 made an index of "5.5" or higher but less than "6," making a total of 672 attaining the distinguished rating in the semester. Rev. Edward Pacha of the First Christian church has reported that for the last 20 days of June the prayer phone in his church has proved highly successful, at least if number of calls is any indication. Pacha reported that the meter, which has just been installed for the last 20 days, shows that there have been 1,515 calls and there have also been 701 other calls when the line was busy. This is an average of 76 calls a day and 35 busy signals, which means that there have been an average of 111 calls a day.

The number of the phone is 3-3158 and Rev. Pacha, who records the prayers, is interested in any improvements that the people might have. He has requested that anyone who has an idea for improving the prayer phone, such as making the prayer longer, changing it more often or any other suggestion, be placed in an envelope and addressed to "Prayer"
