

Miss U.S.A. To Be Selected Tonight

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (UPI) — Beauty is truth, shocked officials of the Miss Universe contest cried today. The Miss U.S.A. who will be chosen tonight from among 15 finalists will have to win on her own attributes without "falsies" or "waist cinchures."

A watchful official of Catalina swimsuits, which owns title to the contest, looked closely at the American girls preparing to go on stage Wednesday night and made a startling discovery.

"I made those swimsuits," she said. "I can tell when there's something there that's not sup-

posed to be."

Sure enough, 20 of the U.S. contestants were found to be cheating. They had on falsies.

The Catalina official, who asked to remain anonymous, said she demanded that all such artifices be removed, but six girls tried to go on stage without doing so. They were stopped.

"I let them get away with it for photographs," the Catalina lady said, "but I couldn't do it in the contest."

She said one girl was found to be wearing a "waist cinchure," something similar to a corset, and "I don't think it's fair for the girls to wear such things. It's cheating."

The 15 U.S. finalists include Corrine Huff, 19, Youngstown, Ohio, the first American Negro to compete in the Miss Universe contest.

The other Miss U.S.A. finalists with Miss Ohio are from Alabama, California, Connecticut, Florida, Iowa, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Utah, and West Virginia.

The Miss U.S.A. chosen tonight will compete against 44 foreign contestants Friday night. Fifteen finalists will be picked then for the Miss Universe finals Saturday night.

Russian Master Spy Ambassador To Cuba

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sergei Kudryavtsev, who masterminded a widespread Soviet spy ring in Canada during World War II, was named today as Russian ambassador to Cuba.

Tass news agency reported in Moscow that Kudryavtsev, now minister counselor of the Russian embassy in Paris, had been appointed to the Havana post by the Supreme Soviet Presidium.

His new assignment was viewed here as a move to set up a Soviet espionage net at the doorstep of the big U. S. Guantanamo Bay Naval base and less than 100 miles from the Florida coast.

The appointment was sure to put a new strain on deteriorating U.S.-Cuban relations and add support to the view of some congressmen that Fidel Castro's anti-American regime is rapidly becoming a Communist satellite.

As first secretary of the Soviet legation (later embassy) in Canada between 1942 and 1945, Kudryavtsev was one of the early bosses of the Russian espionage ring in that country.

The operation was exposed when Igor Gouzenko, a code clerk in the Russian embassy in Ottawa, defected to the West on Sept. 5, 1945.

Death Of Bevan Is Mourned By Britons

TREDEGAR, Wales (UPI) — Britons today mourned the death of Aneurin Bevan, a Welsh miner who rose to second rank behind Winston Churchill as Britain's most heroic politician.

Members of Parliament and ordinary people on street corners throughout the nation wept openly when Bevan's death at the age of 62 was announced Wednesday after an illness complicated by a serious abdominal operation last December.

In death, Bevan received an unexpected and moving tribute from Prime Minister Harold Macmillan, who said: "He was a . . . real personal friend."

McMillan and other British leaders praised the memory of a man who was often described as a re-

bel, hell-raiser and leftist in the House of Commons.

Tributes to Bevan — who never wanted anyone to call him Bevan or Aneurin but only "Nye" — poured in from many parts of the globe today.

"Farewell, bright spirit," said

Daily Express writer William Barkley. The Express often viewed with horror the solid support Bevan gave to British socialism and the Labor Party of which he was deputy leader.

Bevan was the man who fashioned the National Health Service.

Although he never realized his ambition to become prime minister he was known as the only politician who could nearly hold his own with the men considered by many persons to be the 20th Century's greatest English orator, Churchill.

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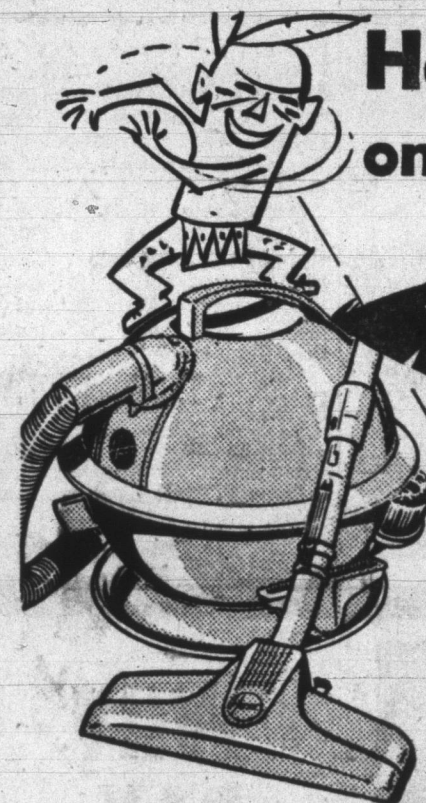
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
