Kennedy's Lack Of Experience Attacked

INDIANAPOLIS (UPI) — The GOP "truth squad" Tuesday night attacked the "lack of experience" of Sen. John F. Kennedy who spoke here at a \$100-a-plate fundraising dinner.

The squad, composed of two United States senators and two representatives, is dogging the trail of Kennedy and undertaking to offer rebuttal to his campaign speeches. They flew here from Illinois shortly before Kennedy arrived from Chicago.

"We are amazed to hear Sen. Kennedy make the startling statement Monday night in Springfield: 'I don't think experience

necessarily counts,'" the lawmakers said. "This new Kennedy campaign theme of running for the White House on a platform of inexperience follows a favorite Kennedy attack tactic that stands up to Khrushchev (Russian premier) is not enough; then the Democratic candidate speaks disparagingly of the face-to-face meetings of Vice President Nixon and the Soviet leader.

"Thus Sen. Kennedy seems to imply that he can't stand up to Khrushchev and he admits his lack of experience," the lawmakers said.

The four on the squad are Sens. Roman L. Hruska, Nebraska, and Hugh Scott, Pennsylvania, and Reps. Donald Jackson, California, and Charles E. Goodell, New York.

"Perhaps the reason Sen. Kennedy discounts experience can be found in his own legislation background and record," the lawmakers said. "With 14 years in Congress, not a single major piece of legislation bears the Kennedy name and stamp."

Cuba Demands Death Penalty For Seven Men

CAMAGUEY, Cuba (UPI) — The state has demanded death by firing squad for seven of 22 men charged with complicity in a mid-summer attempt to seize a government strongpoint near here, it was announced today.

A prosecution spokesman said the revolutionary regime will demand prison terms for the other 15 men involved in the Aug. 8 attack on Fort Jatibonico. One soldier and one attacker were killed in the clash.

The 22 defendants go on trial before a "revolutionary tribunal" here Thursday.

At the same time, however, it was reported that Argentine Ambassador to Cuba Julio Amoedo was returning to the post in Havana from which he was recalled last month.



Warmer Weather Is Forecast In State

Low temperatures in the 40s were recorded in Indiana again today but mild above-normal readings were expected to prevail into early next week.

It was 41 at Lafayette, 46 at Fort Wayne, 48 at Indianapolis and 49 at Goshen following temperatures in the upper 60s and low 70s over most of the state Tuesday.

Little if any precipitation was forecast. For the north, the total for the five days will be no more than one-tenth of an inch in showers tonight, perhaps confined to

Evansville was an exception, with a high of 78 Tuesday and an overnight low of 59.

The outlook for the five-day period ending next Monday indicated temperatures averaging 6 to 8 degrees above normal in the northern third of the state and 2 to 5 degrees above normal in the central and south.

Highs today will range from the mid 70s to 80, lows tonight from the 50s to 62, and highs Thursday from 68 to near 80. Friday will be generally fair and a little warmer.




