PROJECT MERCURY (FTHNC) — Patrick L. Ellenberger, yeoman seaman apprentice, USN son of Mrs. Joyce Ellenberger of 133 South Tenth St., Decatur, Ind., is serving aboard the anti-submarine destroyer USS Fred T. Berry, a unit which participated in the recovery operations of the "Project Mercury" orbital space flight May 24.

The "Aurora 7" space craft which carried Navy Lt. Cdr. Malcolm Scott Carpenter on the three-orbit flight was retrieved at sea by the destroyer USS John R. Pierce. The astronaut, first sighted aloft after the earth-orbiting flight by a Navy patrol aircraft, was picked from the Atlantic by a Navy helicopter which took him to the aircraft carrier USS Intrepid. He later was flown to Grand Turk Island in the Bahamas.

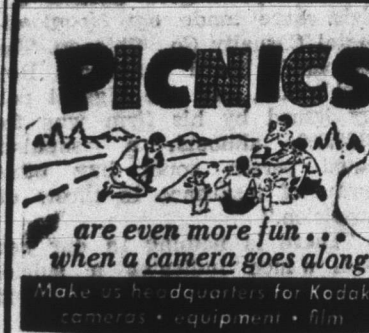
