New Violence
In Tense Oran

ALGIERS (UPI)—Shooting
broke out today near the Roman
Catholic cathedral in the wake
of a curfew imposed in the wake
of 19 Algerians and 17 Europeans
were massacred in nighttime riots
Thursday.

The renewed violence came
only a few hours after the end of
a curfew imposed in the wake of
the earlier rioting. The provision-
al Algerian government immedi-
ately ordered a new midday cur-
few.

Details of today's shooting
were not immediately available.
Algerian guards claimed the first
shots came from apartments oc-
cupied by Europeans in the city
which had been a stronghold of
the terrorist secret army organi-
zation (OAS).

Almost at the same time Al-
gerian police fired on a speeding
truck which ignored an order to
halt.

Wild Celebrations End
Thursday's bloodshed ended
wild celebrations hailing the coun-
try's independence. Today's in-
cidents indicated peace still is a
long way off.

As the split between nationalist
Premier Ben Youssef Ben Khed-
da and dissident Vice Premier
Mohammed Ben Bella widened,
the Algerian provisional govern-
ment moved to give Ben Khedda
direct control of the nation.

Before the shooting broke out
in Oran, 800 Moslems stormed in-
to the Catholic cathedral in Al-
giers and desecrated it. Many of
the Moslems were women shout-
ing their "you-you-you" cries.
The mob invaded the cathed-
ral protesting that the build-
ing originally was a mosque and
should be returned to the Mos-
lems.

A cathedral spokesman said the
demonstrators ripped the arms
from a statue of St. Joan of Arc,
broke her sword, threw some
church furnishings to the ground
and damaged the archbishop's
throne.

The demonstrators dispersed
after Algerian police arrived.

New Exodus to France
Thursday's Oran massacre
spurred a new exodus by Euro-
peans from Algeria. Within an
hour after the original curfew was
lifted in Oran, nearly 1,000 Euro-
peans lined up outside ship and
airline offices to buy tickets to
France.

Earlier reports said Ben Bella
planned to fly today from Cairo
to Morocco where units of the Al-
gerian Nationalist Army (ALN)
have rallied to his support. But
Ben Bella said today he planned
to stay in Cairo for a "few days."

French sources said the provi-
sional executive was considering
a merger or coalition which
would legalize control by Ben
Khedda's Algerian Provisional
Government (GPRA) until a full-
term government is elected.

The Evian peace agreement be-
tween France and the Algerian
rebels made the provisional ex-
ecutive the caretaker regime after
independence.
