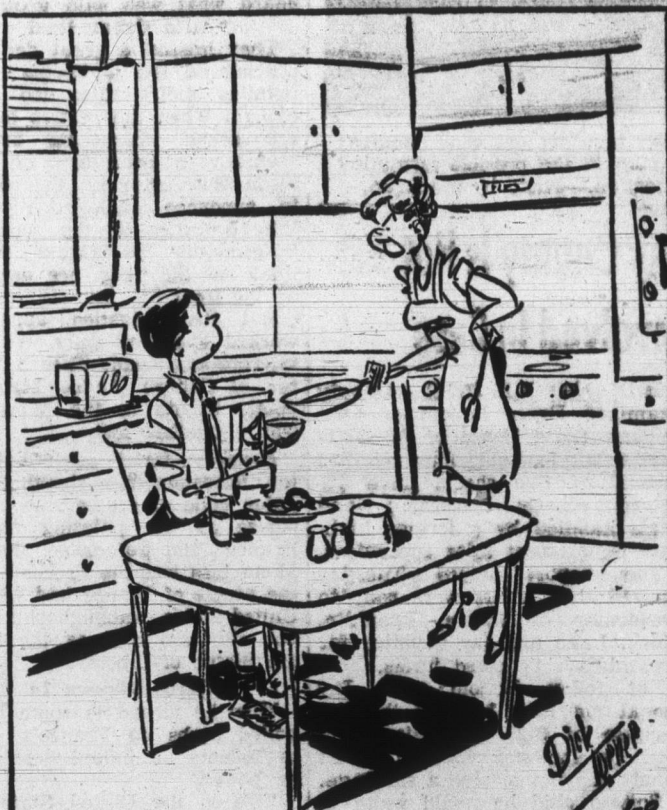
Q. I'd like to mail a check to my niece, who will be married
