



Kennedy Asks
System Set Up
For Defenders

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Kennedy asked Congress today to set up a system for appointment of public defenders to represent people who can't afford lawyers to defend them in federal criminal cases.

"Whenever the lack of money prevents a defendant from securing an experienced lawyer, trained investigator or technical expert, an unjust conviction may follow," the President said.

Kennedy sent the House and Senate a draft of legislation which he said would "diminish the role which poverty plays in our federal system of criminal justice."

In a letter to the presiding officers of the Senate and House, Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson and Speaker John W. McCormack, the President said the bill would "assure effective legal representation for every man whose limited means would otherwise deprive him of an adequate defense against criminal charges."

He added: "The need to protect this basic right makes enactment of this measure imperative."

Kennedy attached to his letter a note sent him by his brother, Atty. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy, which pointed to "a striking portrait of our federal courts' inability to offer equal justice to the poor."

The attorney general said that "under typical procedures prevailing in the federal system, no

MIAMI (UPI) — A Pan American Airways four-engine jet is scheduled to ferry 15,000 pounds of medicines to Cuba today and is expected to return here with about 100 Cuban-Americans seeking asylum.

The Red Cross chartered DC6B will carry the supplies as part of the \$53 million in ransom promised Fidel Castro in return for the release of 1,113 Bay of Pigs prisoners at Christmastime.
