



**PCA Loans Pass  
\$300 Million Mark**

Production Credit Association passed the \$300 million mark in loans outstanding in the Fourth Farm Credit District on Thursday, April 18, according to information received today by Forrest E. Duncan, manager of the Eastern Indiana Production Credit Association.

The 40 Production Credit Associations in Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky and Tennessee are currently asking farm production loans at the \$1 1/2 million a day. The associations are just beginning their 30th year of operation and have active loans to 65,000 farmers in the four states.

"This all-time record," reports Homer C. Hayward, president of the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Louisville, "results from a continued increase in the number of farm families using Production Credit Associations as their source of farm operating credit. Because agriculture is continuing its trend toward large and more efficient operating units, farmers are finding it necessary to increase their investment in equipment and other crop and livestock production assets in order to keep abreast of this trend."

The Eastern Indiana Production Credit Association has had a part in the increased business. Manager Mr. Duncan says by having increased its loans by 6.1 per cent in 1963 over the same period a year ago. Through April 18, the local association made loans amounting to \$5,390,061 to farmers in Adams, Hamilton, Blackford, Delaware, Grant Madison, Wells, Randolph, Jay, and Tipton counties.

**Bachhaus Brothers  
Win Breed Award**

Backhaus brothers herd attracts national attention by winning "Constructive Breeder Award."

For Distinguished success as a breeder of registered Ayrshire dairy cattle, Backhaus brothers, Decatur, Ind., has been presented the "Constructive Breeder Award" by the Ayrshire Breeders' Association, Brandon, Vt. This was the 7th award to be won by Backhaus Bros. In order to qualify for this honor, one of the most coveted prizes in dairy cattle circles, it is necessary for the herd to excel in both production and type. Only ani-

mals bred by the herd owner are considered for this award.

On a strictly twice-a-day milking schedule for 305 days, the 15 cows bred by the CBA winner made an annual production average of 10785 lbs. of milk and 455 lbs. of butterfat, M.E.

The herd has a type classification average score of .870 and 88 per cent of the herd was bred by Backhaus Bros.




