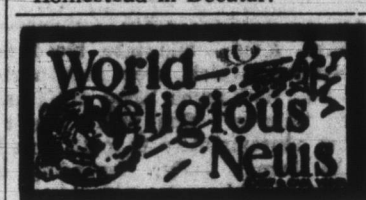

This residence hall is for girls who are entering the field of home economics. Miss Collier is planning to enter Purdue University this fall where she will study dietetics and nutrition.

Selection to Twin Pines is made on a basis of scholarship, achievement, and recommendation of the county home demonstration council. This residence hall was purchased and is maintained by the Home Demonstration Clubs of Indiana. A membership to Twin Pines is equivalent to an annual \$300 scholarship.

Cynthia has been very active in youth and community affairs in Decatur. She is a member of the Methodist youth fellowship, Girl Scouts, Rainbow Girls, and 4-H club. She has represented Adams county at the Purdue 4-H round-up and at the 4-H junior leader conference at DePauw University. An enrollment of 786 students at the five theological seminaries of the United Church of Christ was reported by denominational headquarters. The announcement said the total represented a 5 percent increase over the figure of July 1961.

India's 350 million people, one-sixth of the world's total population, live in an area less than three-fifths of the area of the United States. The people of India are 85 percent Hindu, 10 percent Moslem and 2 1/2 percent Christian.

Uganda has changed its national anthem to include the name of God. The first line of the anthem

now reads, "O Uganda, may God uphold thee." It replaces, "O Uganda, thy people praise thee." Uganda, a British protectorate since 1894, became independent last October. The nation's population of 6,500,000 includes Catholics, 30 percent; Protestants, 25 percent; and Moslems, 5 percent.

American Protestants and Eastern Orthodox church members will be asked for \$1,000,110 in a special appeal during the Thanksgiving season to finance the "Share Our Surplus Program," through which more than 10,000,000 of the world's hungry will receive U. S. surplus foods. The 1963 appeal was announced by Canon Almon R. Pepper, chairman of the executive committee of Church World Service, National Council of Churches. SOS foodstuffs—\$30,000,000 pounds valued at \$30 million—are scheduled for distribution in 1963 to the world's hungry in 32 areas of acute need in Asia, Africa, Latin America, Europe and the Middle East.

**THE BETTER WAY**

Frequently men who have made lots of money, attained enviable positions of prestige and importance are regarded as the only men who are successful. It might be well to recall what happened to eight of the world's most successful financiers who met together in 1923. They were Charles Schwab, president of the largest independent steel company, who died a bankrupt and lived on borrowed money the last five years of his life; president of the largest gas company, Howard Hopson, who is now insane; the greatest wheat speculator, Arthur Cutten, who died abroad, insolvent; the president of the New York Stock Exchange, Richard Whitney, recently released from Sing Sing penitentiary; Albert Fall, member of the President's cabinet, pardoned from prison so he could die at home; the greatest "bear"
