Missionary For 42 Years Is Retiring

INDIANAPOLIS (UPI) — Earth-
quakes and revolutions failed to
discourage Jessie M. Trout from
a career of 42 years as a mis-
sionary.

She was born in 1901 in
Indiana and has been a
missionary ever since. She has
traveled to 40 countries and
has written 12 books.

"Slow Her Down"

"We are just hoping to slow her
down," they said. "She has done
so much for the Disciples. At the
international convention in Miami
she will be a recognition service
pointing out some of the work she
has done."

A major portion of that work,
which has taken her frequently
into remote areas of the world,
has been as an executive, but by
her own request, she returned to
the mission field for the last two
years of her career.
