

Lamb Sale

The reserve champion lamb, owned by Rex Journey, sold to the First State Bank of Decatur, for 28 cents a pound.

The 90-pound ribbon winner brought a total of \$25.20.

Only three other sheep were sold.

The sales, listed in order of owner, purchaser, weight, price per pound and sale total were:

David Singleton to Greenbelt Fertilizer, 95 lbs. at .33 for \$31.95; Keith Fox, to Ernie's Auction, 80 lbs. at .30 for \$24; Richard Painter to Greenbelt Fertilizer, 65 pounds at .29 \$24.35.

This year's sheep sale animals average 82 pounds, sold for an average of 29 cents a pound to bring an average of \$24.35 each.

Last year's animals averaged 90 pounds and sold for an average of 24.6 cents per pound to bring an average of \$22.10.

Last year the grand champion 85-pound lamb, owned by Robert Field, sold for 80 cents a pound to bring \$50.

Swine Sale

One of four grand champion swine owned by Patty Thieme brought top dollar in the swine sale.

Weighting in at 225 pounds, it brought one dollar per pound, just as did the grand champion steer, and was purchased by the First State Bank of Decatur.

The bank also purchased the second pig of the evening, a 225-pound entrant owned by Stephen Kershner, for 45 cents a pound, a sale which totaled out at \$101.25.

Last year the grand champion a 205-pounder owned by Marsha King, went for \$1.20 per pound to bring \$246.

The 1961 grand champion sold for \$1.425 per pound, and weighed 225 pounds to bring \$320.

This year's pigs average 197 pounds each and sold for an average of 33.5 cents per pound to bring \$66.35.

Last year the average was 201 pounds at 33.4 cents for \$66.35.

In 1961 it was even higher: 205 at 38.94 cents per pound for \$80.16 per pig.
