Presbyterian Handbell Choir To Appear Here Monday

The First Presbyterian Church Handbell choir of Fort Wayne will be guest performers for the opening dinner of the Decatur Woman's club, which will be held at the Youth and Community Center Monday at 6:30 p.m.

This annual event, which is attended by all of the members of the various Woman's club departments, is the highlight of the season and officially opens the club year.
