EVANSVILLE, Ind. (UPI)—

The college, now third largest in Indiana, has 805 per cent since September, 1945. Over 10,200 students are expected next fall, Hauptman said.

Delaware County has 1,618 students enrolled for 18.6 per cent of the total enrollment. The number of students from other Indiana counties is as follows:
