PROCLAMATION

CANCER EDUCATION MONTH

WHEREAS, the scope of the cancer problem is so great that none are safe from attack—at the present rate, cancer will strike one person in every four, and it will strike in two out of every three homes in our community; and

WHEREAS, many thousands more could be saved from cancer each year if the public took full advantage of the detection and treatment methods now available to them—one-half of all cancer patients could be saved if the disease were detected and properly treated in the early stage; and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society has an outstanding arsenal of strategically planned education weapons to inform people of the best ways to guard their lives against needless cancer death—these include motion pictures, filmstrips, exhibits, posters, publications, news media materials, and many others, all available on a free or free-loan basis; and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society through its local units strives to reach people with these lifesaving materials throughout the year; and with a concentrated, strictly educational effort during November, lifesaving, cancer educational programs are offered to business and industries, the news media, clubs and organizations, and schools and colleges;

Midwest Steel Co. Refuses Comment

INDIANAPOLIS (UPI) — A spokesman for Midwest Steel Co. refused Monday to reply to "some wild comment" by an attorney for the Save the Dunes Council, Inc., that Midwest's parent firm may "no longer be interested in constructing an integrated steel-making facility" at Burns Ditch.

The Midwest spokesman said he had "heard of some wild comment" concerning National Steel Corp.

"We will not dignify this statement by a reply, and that is official," he said.

Secretary-treasurer Clinton Green of the Indiana Port Commission also disputed the comment by Leonard D. Rutstein, issued through the council's public relations office in Fort Wayne Monday morning.

"Nothing that has been said to me indicates this is true," Green said. "The Midwest people have never said what year they plan to build an integrated steel mill but they did say when they built the rolling mill at Burns Waterway it would not be feasible to have it there unless they eventually did build a steel-making plant close at hand."

Dismisses Appeal On Behalf Of Teenager

INDIANAPOLIS (UPI) — The Indiana Appellate Court Monday dismissed an appeal sought on behalf of a teenager, Edna O'Dell Adams, Indianapolis, who was declared a delinquent child by the Marion County Juvenile Court.

The action was taken on grounds the girl was "loud and boisterous" in a drug store and frequently absent from school.

Peru Man Is Found Guilty In Slaying

PERU, Ind. (UPI) — A Miami Circuit Court jury returned a manslaughter verdict Monday at midnight against Rupert Willie Thorpe, 20, a former factory worker here, in the bludgeon death of a Massachusetts tourist.

The jury deliberated for more than 10 hours on a second-degree murder charge before returning the guilty verdict on the lesser charge. Judge Frank V. Dice ordered a pre-sentence investigation, with sentencing set for Thursday.

Thorpe was indicted for the Aug. 19 death of Raymond Ralph McCarthy, 27, West Springfield, Mass. McCarthy's body was found at a gravel pit about a mile northwest of here.

Thorpe had told the jury he struck McCarthy in self defense during a struggle which he said developed when McCarthy made improper advances.

Law Enforcement Officers Meeting

The show was to go on today at the Michigan-Indiana-Ohio law enforcement officers meeting in Fort Wayne, despite a bank robbery to which threatened to disrupt the annual meeting.

Adams county deputy sheriff Harold August was one of numerous law enforcement officials from the three states to attend the meeting, which began at the Club Olympia near the Key motel in the northern end of town, at noon. The meetings are held in order:

to give law officers from Michigan Indiana and Ohio an opportunity to discuss various matters concerning law enforcement.

A number of Fort Wayne and area officers would probably have to miss the meeting, however, thanks to a successful bank robbery. The robber netted an estimated \$8,400 in an armed robbery at a bank on the Goshen Road, around 10 o'clock this morning.

Fort Wayne officers were still hunting the robber when the meeting opened at noon. The bandit had taken the bank manager with him and left him in an abandoned car — near the site of the meeting at the Club Olympia.
