Now's Your Chance!

When you mail your Christmas cards to out-of-town friends, be sure to include your post office ZIP number on your return address, so your friends can include it on your mail next year!

This will help speed the post office's handling of your mail, and make fewer handlings of it necessary.

In case you've forgotten, if you live in Decatur, or on a Decatur route, your ZIP number is 46733. Your postmaster can tell you if you call him, and will be very glad if you include it on your return to your Christmas friends.

ZIP stands for zone improvement program. The idea is to cut a day or two off the time it takes to handle your mail when it has to go very far, by making all mail easier to handle.

To handle the mail easier, it must be somewhat standardized. That is why in July, 1961, the size of envelopes was standardized between certain minimum and maximum sizes — before that, if you wanted to send a post card ten feet long, you could — at regular postage rates per ounce. But think of the cost of handling that one separate piece of mail!! The cost of the stamps didn't come close to covering the special handling of the over-size piece.

Likewise, canceling machines would miss small pieces, or oddly shaped pieces.

You wouldn't like it if every coin and piece of money you handled was shaped differently, and worth a different amount. It would make figuring bills very difficult. That is why money is standardized. It is also why postage is standardized — to speed our handling and reception of it.

And we are all interested in costs. The post office operates more inexpensively — and our taxes will be lower — if we use ZIP numbers, and cooperate with the postal employees in making their tasks easier and more enjoyable. If not — well, we'll have to pay for the difference!
