Where Were You?

More than 200 local people gave an enthusiastic reception Tuesday night to a fine travel program on Lapland presented by the Decatur Optimists at the Decatur community center.

This program introduced the club's coming attractions—presenting to the public six top-notch travel movies in color, narrated by professional lecturers.

We, the general public, are invited to buy tickets for \$5 to the six lectures—three during the basketball season will be on Saturday evenings, and three later in the spring will be on Tuesday evenings.

The audience Tuesday night was practically unanimous in unqualified praise of the program. Filmed, as it was, in the brilliant colors of the land of the midnight sun, it dealt with the ordinary, day-to-day lives of the Lapps, the "reindeer people" of far-northern Finland. It showed the cabins into which they have settled since ending their former nomad lives, the modern architecture of today's Finland, ways of transportation, and the unique products of the ingenious people.

The series, if you attend it, will be one of most enjoyable cultural experiences of your life. In fact, it will not only be interesting to you—your older children will enjoy it at a cost of only 50c a movie.

Future programs include the Canadian Rockies, Egypt, thrills on the Colorado river, Germany and the Berlin story, a solo safari to South Africa by a woman, and India—the land of the spectacular. There are few of us who have not speculated on an imaginary trip up the Nile river to the home of the ancient pharaohs, or to the Taj Mahal, or brightened at the thought of shooting the rapids of the Colorado river in a rubber raft. Now is our chance to do it, without leaving Decatur, without being cold and wet, or hot and miserable, in foreign travel!
