Two Freed Airmen Under Questioning

WIESBADEN, Germany (UPI) — Two U.S. Air Force officers released Friday by the Russians were questioned today by American intelligence officers about the shooting down of their unarmed jet reconnaissance plane over East Germany.

Air Force sources said G-2 (Intelligence) wants to know why the RB66 strayed over East Germany March 10 and what happened after the fliers were shot down by Communist fire.

The sources said the officials may ask the fliers whether they detected Communist electronic interference that might have lured them into a Soviet jet fighter trap.

Capt. David I. Holland, 35, of Holland, Minn., and Melvin J. Kessler, 20, of Philadelphia, were released Friday after 17 days in Communist captivity.

Doctors at the Air Force hospital here gave the two men a quick medical checkup Friday night and sources said they were in "good condition."

The navigator of the RB66, 1st Lt. Harold W. Welch, 24, of Detroit, Mich., broke an arm and a leg parachuting from the plane. He has been in the hospital since he was freed last week.

(In Moscow, diplomatic circles said the release of the fliers—despite renewed charges that they were aerial spies—was interpreted as a clear sign that Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev did not want to allow the incident to cause a serious rift in U.S.-Soviet relations.)

The RB66 was the second unarmed U.S. plane shot down by the Communists in Germany this year. Three officers were killed when their T39 jet trainer was downed in January. Shortly after handing Holland and Kessler over to U.S. military liaison officers at the East German border checkpoint of Marienborn, the Soviets repeated charges that the RB66 was on a spy mission.

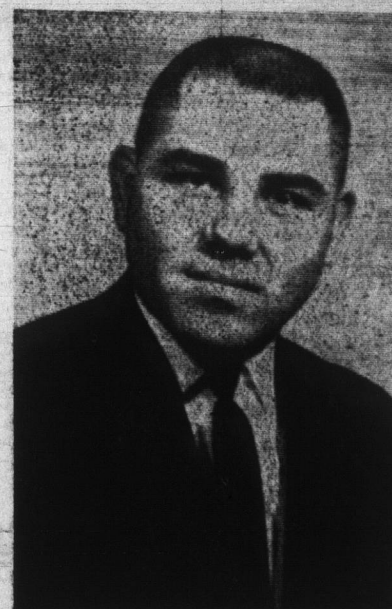
