The small, bowlegged native Maya can still be seen in the area, but poor farming methods have left them starving.

The Archbolds had a wonderful 18 days seeing old ruins and new sights; Mrs. Archbold ranks this trip with one they took a few years ago through north-east Canada and back through New England.

You see, a lot of life is who you do with it— you can go and enjoy life—all of it—or you can sit home and mope. Think of the wonderful life the Archbolds have made for themselves after some people have "retired"!
