

Famous Stallions Tour U. S., Canada

For the first time in history the famous white stallions of Vienna's Spanish riding school, the Lipizzaner horses, will tour eight cities in the United States and Canada, with the opening performance this week in Philadelphia. The entire Philadelphia engagement and the next one at Washington, D.C., have been sold out since February.

The equestrian attraction is said to be the oldest continuing performing group in the western world, having been established for 400 years. Tickets have been selling for as high as \$8, each. These horses are featured in Walt Disney's Technicolor picture, "The Miracle of the White Stallions," which plays Sunday and Monday at the Adams theater.

Two jet planes were chartered to bring the steeds from Vienna, as only 12 horses are allowed to each plane and there are 20 in the troupe. The finale of the production is the presentation in a huge arena of the stallions in the famous act, that is now doing sell-out business in the nation's largest cities.

Invited To Parley On Civil Defense

Thirty-seven persons from Adams county are invited to a special civil defense conference to be held Wednesday, April 15, in Fort Wayne. It will begin at 9 a. m. in the conference room of the library at the Indiana Institute of Technology and close at 3 p. m.

Presented by the Indiana department of civil defense and Indiana University, the meeting will be for city and county officials and civil defense directors from Adams, Allen, DeKalb, Huntington, Steuben, Wells and Whitley counties.

The objectives of the conference will be to provide current, factual information concerning the effects of nuclear weapons, and protective measures which can be taken to minimize casualties in the event of nuclear attack; provide better understanding of federal and state civil defense programs; to acquaint community leaders with the problems and responsibilities of civil defense at the local level, and to provide assistance in defining and resolving these problems.

Ivan McKathie, controller of Fort Wayne, will welcome the conference guests at the opening session. The conference will close with a summary of the day's program by Robert S. Bates, director of the Indiana department of civil defense.
