



Dr. Landrum R. Bolling was elected president of the Council of Protestant Colleges and Universities recently.

The Church of England has organized a new commission on Roman Catholic relations to pursue "informal friendly discussions" on theological questions.

In a recent survey to determine what people thought of Sunday, it was found that many people regard it merely as a day of rest. Slightly more than half of American adults will be in church on an average Sunday with two-thirds of the population in church at least once a month.

A three-year project to excavate the ancient Biblical city of Gilead has started under the sponsorship of the University Museum of the University of Pennsylvania. A scientific staff of eight persons from the U.S. England and Jordan will work with a force of 125 laborers from nearby villages.

Church membership statistics of the 15 largest Protestant and Eastern Orthodox church bodies reveal a total of 68,931,691. Roman Catholics claim a membership of 43,847,938. There are 60,000 Buddhists recorded. Jews number 5,509,000. All church membership reported in the Year book of American Churches total 117,946,002. Southern Baptists are the largest Protestant group with a total membership of 10,191,303.
