

## School Dance Band To Play For Show

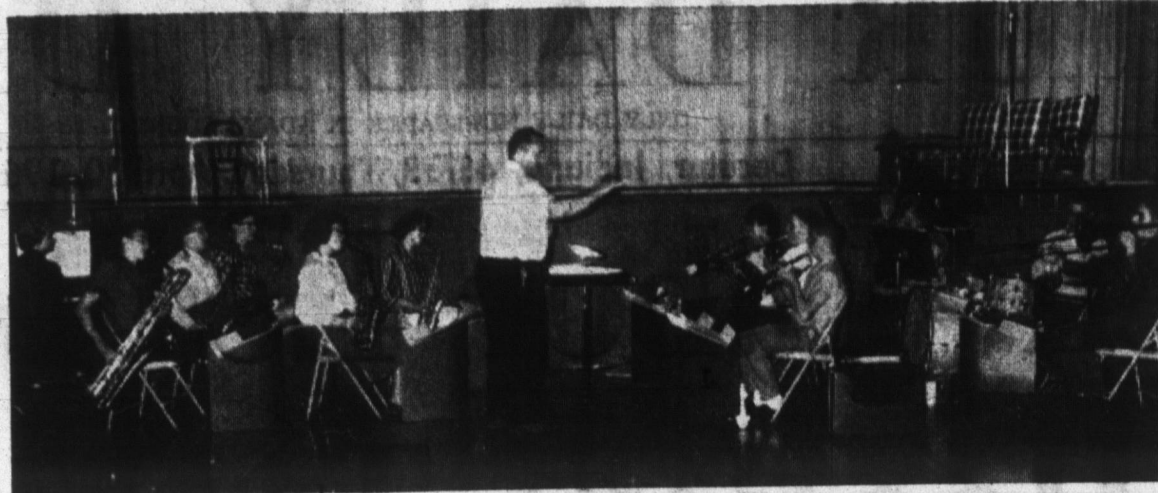

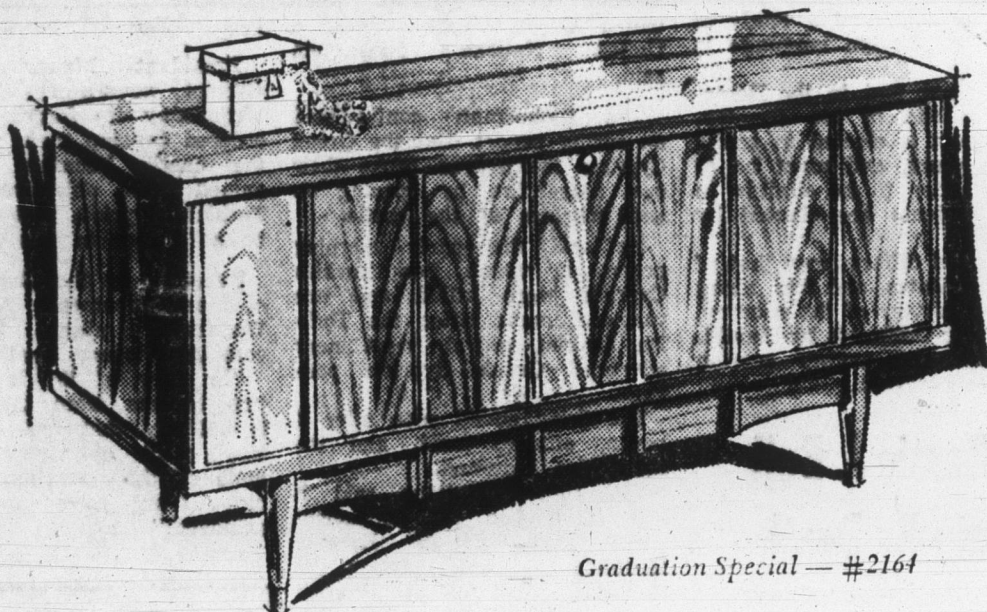

## Concert On Friday At Adams Central
