

COME TO CHURCH SUNDAY



Episcopal Church Foundation is establishing a series of graduate fellowships in sociology, social planning, psychology, and anthropology "to equip clergy of the Church better to meet today's social problems."

Dr. Harold E. Fey will retire as editor of The Christian Century, on August 31. A Disciple of Christ minister, Dr. Fey will become visiting professor of Christian social ethics at the Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis, beginning in September. A successor to Dr. Fey will be announced at a later date.

Forty per cent of the members of Baptist churches in Yugoslavia are under 35 years of age. There are 46 Baptist churches in Yugoslavia with a total membership of 3,700. There are about 100 additions a year, the majority of whom are young people. A theological seminary was opened by the Baptist Union of Yugoslavia in 1954, with 10 students currently enrolled.

"Christian Endeavor Day" will be observed July 18 at the New York World's Fair, according to announcement made by Harold E. Westerhoff, general secretary of the International Society of Christian Endeavor. Plans under the direction of Milton G. Ballard call for Endeavorers to participate in a luncheon and a special hour-long service of worship in the afternoon.

A Protestant chapel was dedicated in Moscow last month, the first since before the Communists came to power. The chapel is located in a small room in the home of the Rev. and Mrs. Donald V. Roberts near Moscow University. Rev. Roberts is an American Presbyterian minister who serves the English-speaking community in the Soviet capital under auspices of the National Council of Churches of the United States.
