Mrs. Fred Solderer gave the secretary and treasurer's reports,

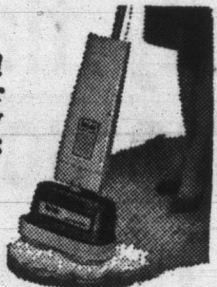
and revealed that money earned from the chili supper was being used to buy materials for the remedial reading program that is to be carried out at Adams Central in the coming years.

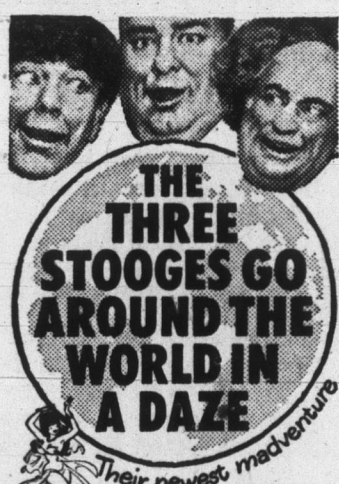

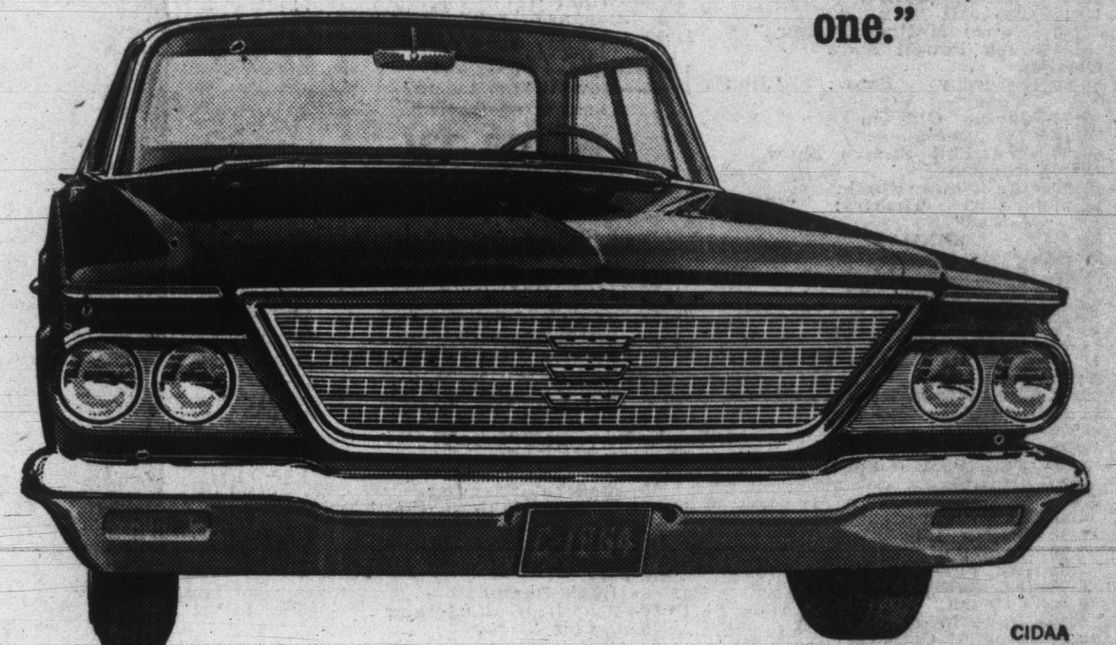
