







Dairy Foods Make Dandy Dinners

The folly month of June, with all its brides, graduates, and perfect days so rare, offers a bonus. It is also Dairy Month—a time to revel in delicious, nutritious food, to try new dairy products and to collect and experiment with new recipes using milk, cheese, yoghurt, cream, sour cream, butter and buttermilk.

To take full advantage of the wealth of dairy products available in supermarkets all over the country, you need ample storage space for both fresh and frozen food. That means you probably need one of the new electric refrigerator-freezers—if you don't already have one.

Although the new combination refrigerator-freezers generally don't look larger or take up more floor space than the older ones, they hold far more food, both fresh and frozen, and keep it at top quality much longer.

With so much fresh food storage space, plus a generous zero-zone freezer section, you can limit your shopping to just once a week. There'll be plenty of space for half-gallon milk bottles and gallon containers of ice cream.

Cheese and butter will be kept at just the right temperature for serving, as well as preserving them. And there'll be room to spare, not only for other dairy products and the rest of your family foods, but for your own home-made dairy-food dishes—main dishes such as macaroni and cheese, cheese and onion pie, and ham and potato chowder, and desserts such as Bavarian cream pie, cheese cake, and custard.

If you're counting calories, you can get lots of nourishment and enjoyment from the low-fat dairy products such as fortified skimmed milk, cottage cheese and the other skimmed milk cheeses, yoghurt, ice milk, and sherbet.

If calories don't count too much, have fun experimenting with heavy cream, ice cream, butter, sour cream and the unlimited varieties of whole milk cheeses.

Hand tools will handle every part of the job. No complicated joinery is called for and the materials list with the plans includes every item needed to complete the project.

New Grilles Simplify Cleaning

Keeping windows in top shape is a snap when they are equipped with the new snap-in grilles now available.

When windows need washing or painting, these special grilles can be removed from the sash in a few seconds without tools. If the grilles themselves are to be painted, the job can be done with either spray or brush without fear of splattering the glass. This eliminates tedious clean-up work.


To add variety, rectangular and diamond grille patterns are available. Often, both patterns are used for different windows in the same house.

Families who have windows with single panes of glass and who want to achieve the Colonial multi-pane look can buy these grilles separately in either pattern and install them in a few minutes. You're out of luck, however, if you don't have wood windows. They're not made for windows made of other materials.

Perky Pergola Lifts Flat Lot



Give oomph to a flat back yard with a curved pergola easily built with Douglas fir posts and connecting 2x6 beams, notched cross pieces of 1x6 fir. Pergola can be set at edge of patio, pool, or placed to accent a special planting bed. Topped with a climbing vine, it can also work as a sunshade.

Barbecue Center Makes Outdoor Cooking Easier

Convenient, protected storage for outdoor cookery equipment is provided in an attractive barbecue center that is easily constructed of wood framing and hardboard panels.

The storage cabinet for charcoal, fire starter, and other items is enclosed with panels of Masonite Weatherall, a factory-primer exterior hardboard. A Peg-Board panel provides space for cooking tools plus shelves for plates, glasses, and other utensils.

The barbecue center is 36" wide and 60" long. Depth of the cabinet section is 30".

Five 2x2-inch posts support the unit. Similar framing also is used for the horizontal supports. Grooves cut in the framing hold the Peg-Board panel firmly in place. This type of construction also gives the barbecue center a professional built appearance.

Here's a fresh attic, remodeling idea—build a dressing room-bath adjacent to a bedroom which could be used by older children or guests.

Use sliding doors or a folding screen to separate the bathroom area from the bedroom. Include a vanity on one wall of the bathroom so that the area can actually serve as a dressing room.

You might be able to include an attractive skylight in the bathroom area. To continue this "open" feeling in the bathroom decor, alternate white and blue Marlite planks on the walls.

More Insulation Pays Off In Lower Bills

Many new homes today are not insulated well enough to provide either optimum comfort or heating and cooling economy. Fortunately, this can be remedied after occupancy. Mineral wool insulation can be blown into exterior walls and attics by a contractor who uses pneumatic equipment.

Many families find that savings on heating often pay for the cost of the additional insulation in a few years. Insulating to recommended standards also adds to the resale value of the house.

An insulating formula established by the National Mineral Wool Insulation Association calls for home owners to use mineral wool with an installed resistance to heat loss of R-19 in ceilings, R-11 in walls and R-13 in floors above unheated spaces.

Canned Goods Easy To Store

Keeping a reasonable supply of canned goods on hand is complicated in some homes because of the shortage of suitable cupboard space. Even where room is available, shelves sometimes just aren't suitable for storing canned goods.

A cabinet that makes canned goods as accessible as books in a library has been designed by the Douglas Fir Plywood Association, Tacoma 2, Wash. A free plan is available from that address.

Because available space will



vary from home to home, the plan is so flexibly handled you can work an extra cabinet in any where you have room, even on top of a base cabinet.

Complete details are included on how to install hardware, how to make shelves fit the needs of your shopping list, and how to handle the simple butt joints that are called for.

FHA Loan Plan Helps Families Remodel Homes

Home improvements that make living more convenient and add to the value of the house can be financed under the Federal Housing Administration's Title 1 program.

Under Title 1, a \$1,000 loan, for example, could be paid off with monthly payments of \$31.94 for three years, or at the rate of \$20.79 per month for five years.

Typical approved remodeling projects under Title 1 include converting an attic to living space, re-roofing with quality asphalt shingles, up-dating a kitchen with new built-in electric appliances like an undercounter automatic dishwasher or built-in electric wall oven and separate built-in surface cooking units.

Maximum amount that can be borrowed under Title 1 is \$3,500. Loans are made by lending institution, but amount is insured by FHA to aid home owners.
