WHAT IS A GOOD FORMULA FOR GETTING ALONG WITH PEOPLE?

Dr. Max Morrison of Pasadena, California, suggests the following: "Many human failures are not due to lack of intelligence or skills. They come because the person cannot cooperate with others around him. Jesus was a well to learn from this elemental lesson in getting along with people, which we call the Golden Rule. 'Whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them.' 'Most of us take ourselves too seriously. When we are overbearing or stubborn, it is hard for us to get along with people. The self-opinionated, self-important, self-righteous person who refuses to give in to unimportant issues exposes his own shallowness. The big soul, the effective person, is never too proud to go the second mile or to admit an error. He is willing to take deserved blame and to forget about getting credit or getting even. When we brood over fancied wrongs or enlarge simple differences, we invite disaster in human relations. When we take refuge in injured pride or hurt feelings, we defeat our own ends by making cooperation impossible.'"

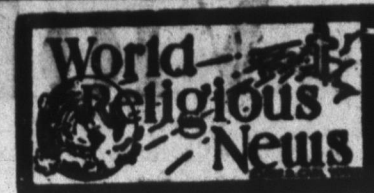
