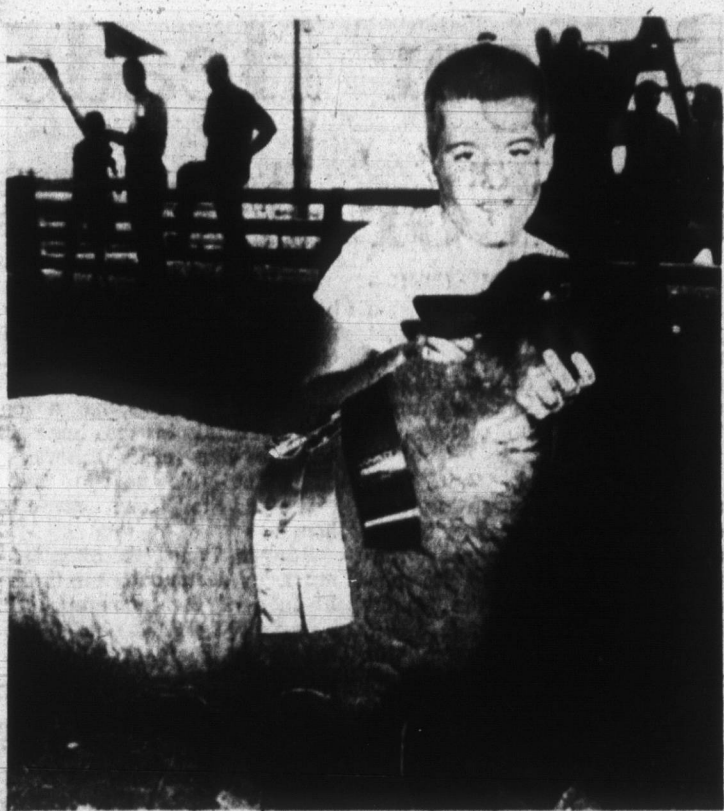


Winners In County 4-H Fair Projects

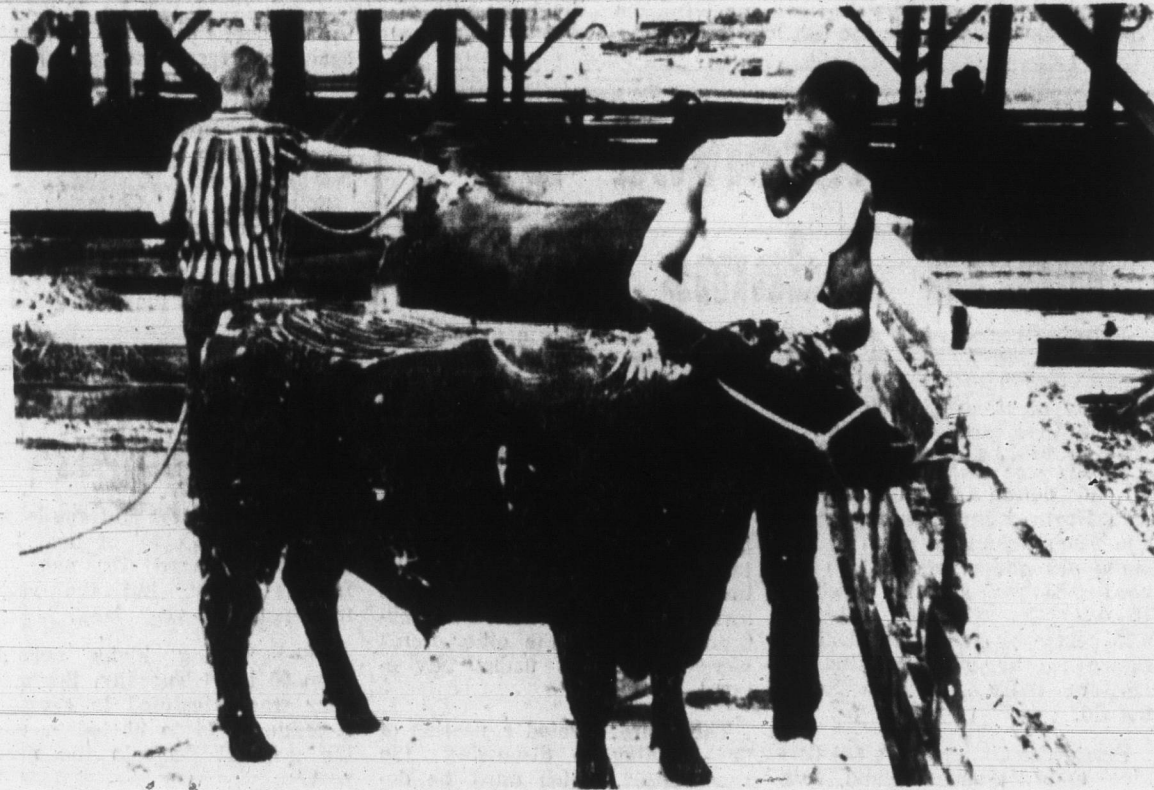
