## The Strange Assertions

One of the weirdest books we have ever read has been pouring into Adams county in such quantity that we feel some comment should be made on it, though any non-partisan reader would certainly relate it to the realm of science-fiction without a second thought.

It is a little book called "A Choice Not An Echo" by Phyllis Schlafly, president of the Illinois Federation of Republican Women. It is probably the most comprehensive collection of half-truths, innuendoes, outright lies and ridiculous charges ever gathered together in 212 pages!

Starting out by charging that the Democrats stole the elections of 1940, 1944, 1948, and 1960, and that "dirty internationalist" Republicans stole control of the Republican party and held it until "Good old Barry" with the help of the little people won it back this summer, it purports to be political history. It is political nonsense and drive.

It seems rather strange that no report was made to grand juries, prosecutors, etc., the country over of all these scandalous "steals". We remember a few of these only too well. A good example was the charge by the Indianapolis Star that the election of 1960 was stolen in Lake county. They screamed and yelled until finally the Republican newspapers there started running a few front-page articles of their own, explaining that it was hogwash, that Lake county Republicans had not committed perjury and allowed their Demo-

cratic colleagues to steal any precincts. They strongly castigated the Star, and they are not going to support the Star's candidate for president, Mr. Goldwater. (For those interested, there are "king-makers" in every faction that controls a political party, Democratic or Republican, and this year, "Honest Barry" has two of the most ruthless, un-American, dictatorial, and anti-average Americans in his corner — Gene Pulliam of Indianapolis, Munice and Arizona, and H. L. Hunt the Texas millionaire whose income is \$250,000 an hour. No wonder they favor a candidate who opposes a graduated net income tax! What a steal it would be for the rich if Goldwater were elected!

Anyone who sincerely wants to end bossism in American political parties would do well by contributing to the party of his choice, and by hard work in the campaign. He would also do well to study the issues.

If, after serious study, you believe in ending social security, public works, all kinds of so-called "foreign" aid, in ending the draft, balancing the budget, cutting taxes, threatening the enemy, unleashing Chiang Ki-Chek, supporting a return to Cuba by the exiles (which Eisenhower tried with his plan for the Bay of Pigs invasion, carried out only a few days after Kennedy took office), ending the graduated net income tax — if you really believe these things, vote, and then turn yourself in — you're a prime candidate for the booby hatch!



