No One Injured In Pair Of Accidents

Two accidents occurred on county roads Tuesday, one being investigated by the sheriff's department, and the other was reported to the same department.

Sheriff Roger Singleton investigated a one-car mishap that happened on county road 4, three miles north and three miles west of Decatur, at 4:30 p.m.

Ronald E. Schnepp, 16-year-old resident of 720 N. Third St., was west bound on the county road when the right front tire of his auto blew out, forcing his auto out of control. The car was swerving as it entered a small bridge, and the right side struck

the cement banister of the bridge.

The auto continued a short distance after knocking a piece of the bridge into the water, before coming to rest. Schnepp was unjured, and damages were estimated at \$200 to the car and \$50 to the bridge.

At 11:30 p.m. Tuesday, Eugene J. Heimann, 35, of route 4, Decatur, reported to the sheriff's department an accident involving the auto he was operating.

Heimann lost control of his car on county road 11, four miles south and three-tenths of a mile west of Decatur, about 15 minutes earlier. The auto went into a ditch and received about \$175 damage.

Rockford Livestock Dealer Is Fined

Lester G. Brandt, livestock dealer of Rockford, O., was fined \$200 and given a three-month suspended sentence by Judge Frank L. Kloeb in U. S. district court at Toledo, O., after pleading guilty to failure to comply with U. S. agriculture department regulations covering the movement of cattle and sheep coming from an infected area.

The Rockford dealer was charged July 3 with transporting 21 head of breeding ewes from Geneva to Mercer county, O., and failed to show the sheep had been inspected or vaccinated.

The federal government's criminal information against Brandt in July explained the imported sheep were not dipped in an approved substance to kill scabies, an ailment prevalent at that time among cattle.

Brandt had been convicted in November, 1959, on a similar charge.

Furnace Motor Is Damaged By Fire

Firemen were summoned to a apartment house at 304 N. Tenth St., at the corner of Jackson St., at 12:55 a.m. today when a furnace motor caught fire.

The motor was the only thing damaged, and was estimated at \$15. Firemen were at the scene of the blaze until 12:45 a.m.

Backhaus Bros. Cow Completes Record

Peggy's Ruth of the Highlands, an eight-year-old registered cow in the Ayrshire herd of Backhaus Bros., Decatur route 3, has completed an official milk production record of 14,170 pounds, with 541 pounds of butterfat, on twice daily milking and for a testing period not exceeding 305 days in length.

The record is one of many being made by an increasing number of registered Ayrshires on the Ayrshire breeders' association of official HIR and DHIR testing programs. It is equal to over 21 quarts of milk per day for the 10-month test period, and is one and seven-eighths time the national average for all dairy cows. Also in the Backhaus herd is Star's Queen Fredericks, aged seven, giving 31,920 pounds of milk, 595 pounds of butterfat, equalling 21 quarts of milk per day for an average of one and seven-eighths times the national average.
