The fact that three out of four boys want scouting, but that only one out of four receives it. Why? Because the parents want someone else to lead the boys. That leaves only a few to do the job. In our schools, den mothers are needed badly if our boys are going to receive the type of scouting necessary to help them. The Boy Scout council cannot do everything. The parents are going to have to help."
