At 9 o'clock this morning, 327 Adams county residents had already cast their votes in the 1964 general election.

Their ball - all absentee - were submitted to the county clerk's office before the deadline Saturday. The ballots are forwarded from the clerk's office to the proper precincts and are not opened or tabulated until after the polls close. The clerk's office reported that it sent out a total of 360 absentee ballot forms. Only 327 were returned.
