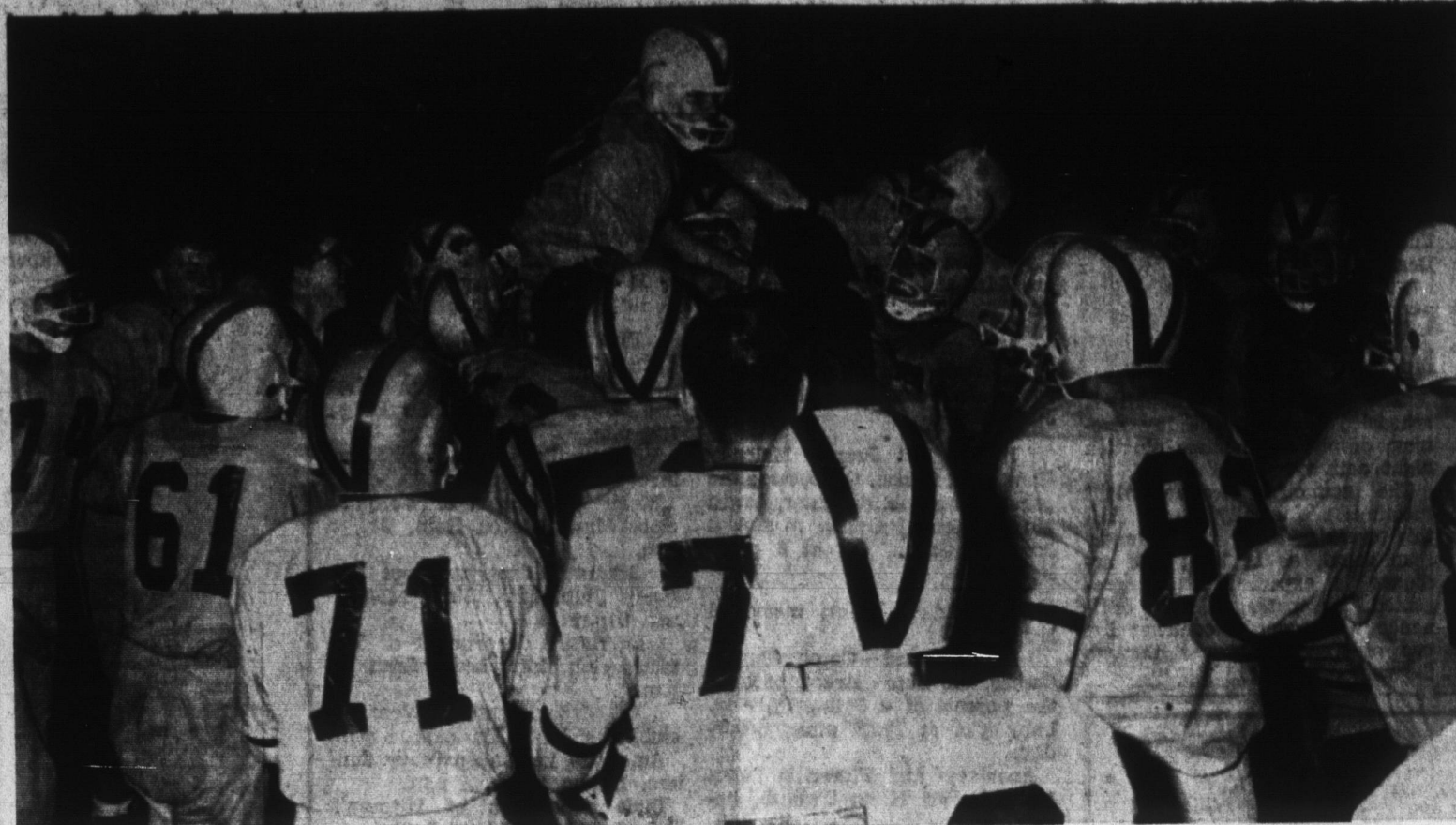

Burger Advances

Mike Burger has won again!

The Monmouth eighth grade student won the 13-year-old competition in the district finals of Punt, Pass & Kick Saturday at Tech field in Indianapolis, and now has a good chance at competing for national honors.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert M. Burger, of route 5, Decatur, is one of 222 boys throughout the United States who became a district champion Saturday. From these 222 champions, 168 boys with the best scores will be selected as Area winners.

The 168 Area winners, top 12 in each of the 14 NFL game areas, will attend an NFL game (with their parents) to compete for 12 national finalists honors.

Harry Schwartz, of Schwartz Ford Co. which sponsored the competition in Decatur, said today that he should learn sometime about the middle or latter part of this week whether or not Burger will get to compete for national honors.

Schwartz explained the scores of the 222 district champions will be compared early this week in Detroit. The 168 boys with the highest scores then win the trip to a National Football League game.

Actually, the top 12 boys in each of the 14 NFL game areas (Burger is in the Chicago Bear area), will be declared Area winners.

The 12 national finalists, six from the NFL Eastern division and six from the NFL Western division, will be taken on a "Tour of Champions" to Washington, D. C., and later attend the NFL championship game.

Burger is the first local winner to ever advance past the Decatur competition in the four-year history of Punt, Pass & Kick.

Hoagland Opens Season Tuesday

Hoagland's Wildcats, one of the eight entrants in the Adams County Sectional tournament last season, open their 1964-65 campaign Tuesday night, playing host to Rock Creek.

This year's Wildcat edition will be a young and inexperienced group that will have a tough time matching last season's 10-10 regular season mark. Coach John Boyer lost his top four scorers from last season, and lists six sophomores on this year's 12-player varsity unit.

Ron Saalfrank, a 5-11 senior forward; Dave Mulligan, 6-2 senior; and Jim Zelt, a 5-9 senior, are the only returnees with much experience. Saalfrank scored 108 points last year, while Mulligan and Zelt accounted for only 82 and 45 points respectively.

Possible Starters

Boyer, beginning his second season at the Wildcat helm, may use Mulligan and Gary Schane, a 6-10 sophomore, at forward, as starters, with Jerry Saalfrank, a 6-3, 185-pound sophomore, at center. Another sophomore, 6-3, 165-pound Denny Hockemeyer, may earn a shot at forward, and move Mulligan to center.

Another sophomore, 5-7 Jim Reinking, is expected to start at guard, with either Zelt or senior Ron Saalfrank.

The 'Cats meet three Adams County teams during the season, playing at Geneva on December 18 and at Adams Central on January 19, after hosting Monmouth on Friday, November 13.

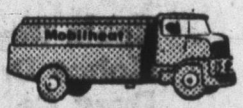
