The Indiana Good Citizenship league, in

session at Indianapolis, yesterday re-

lected S. E. Nicholson of Kokomo as presi-

dent, M. E. Shiel and Kenneth Reid of

Indianapolis were elected secretary and

Word has been received here that 45

more bodies have been recovered from
