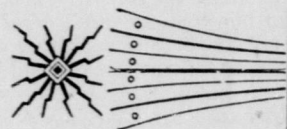

RESOLUTION CHANGING THE VOTING PRECINCTS.

In the city of Decatur, Indiana, and fixing voting places therein: Be it

Resolved, By the common council of the city of Decatur, Indiana, that there be and is hereby established two voting precincts in the First Ward, two voting precincts in the Second Ward and two voting precincts in the Third Ward in the city of Decatur, Indiana. The boundary line between the precincts in the First Ward shall be as follows: Commencing at Line street at its junction with Adams street, thence running south along Line street to Studabaker street, thence east on Studabaker street to Russell street, thence south on Russell and Chestnut streets to the south corporation line. All that part of the said ward laying east and north of the said line shall be known and designated as precinct "A," First Ward, and all that part of the said ward laying west and south of the said line shall be known and designated as precinct "B," First Ward. The voting place in precinct "A" shall be the barn situated on the north-west corner of lot No. 331, that being the barn of A. L. DeVilbiss. The voting place in precinct "B" shall be the office of the Decatur Egg Case Manufacturing Co., situated near the northeast corner of lot No. 40.

The boundary line between the precincts in the Second Ward shall be Seventh street and the south corporation line. All that part of the said ward laying east and north of the said line shall be known and designated as precinct "A," Second Ward, and all that part laying west of the said line shall be known and designated as precinct "B," Second Ward. The

voting place in the said precinct "A" shall be the northwest room in the basement of the court house in said city, and the voting place in precinct "B" shall be in the building situated on lot No. ——— known as the John Nichols tin shop building.

BATTLESHIP WISCONSIN.

Strike of Steel Molders Materially Delays Work on the Vessel.

San Francisco, March 8.—Owing to the strike of the steel molders at the Pacific rollingmills in this city, work upon the battleship Wisconsin, which was recently ordered rushed, has been delayed very materially. The men were asked to work overtime and they struck for extra wages, which was considered exorbitant by the officials of the rollingmills. The result was that almost the entire force of molders went out. The foundrymen are now considering the advisability of shipping the plans for the necessary castings east to some one of the large works there.

NO GOLD CONTRACTS.

Action of Lower House of the Kentucky Legislature.

Frankfort Ky., March 5.—The house of representatives has passed, by a party vote, an act to prevent the making of a contract payable in gold, and making such a contract null and void.

Dr. S. Atwood Smith of Louisville, introduced the bill, and warmly advocated its passage. It is substantially a copy of the Nebraska law, and prevents the discrimination of either metal against the other, and declares both gold and silver legal tender in payment of debts on exactly the same terms.

TORPEDOBOATS FOR RUSSIA.

Precautionary Measures Against Closing of the Suez Canal.

Odessa, March 8.—The Russian government has ordered 30 new torpedo boats to augment the Russian Pacific squadron at Vladivostok and Port Arthur. Russia also proposes to let eight cruisers of the volunteer fleet continually in far eastern waters, instead of the Black sea, so as to avoid the possibility of being hampered by Great Britain closing the Suez canal.

CRAZED MOTHER.

She Kills Her Little Four-Year-Old Boy With a Razor.

Grove City, O., March 5.—Mrs. Olan Demorest yesterday took the life of her 4-year-old son, Arden, with a razor, and was proceeding to murder her husband, who was too ill to resist, when the servant girl aroused the neighbors, and the woman was overpowered. Her husband was a teacher, out of employment, and she recently showed evidences of approaching insanity.

New Turkish Minister.

Constantinople, March 5.—Ali Ferouk Bey, the newly appointed Turkish minister to the United States, has started for his post at Washington. Ali Ferouk Bey was appointed early in October last to succeed Mustapha Bey. He studied in Paris for five years and was for two years secretary of the Turkish legation in London.
