

Triumphs of Medicine.

In the year 1800, Bichat, who was styled "The Napoleen of Medicine," published his "Treatise on Membranes," followed soon after by his "General Anatomy." In 1808 aseptization was developed by the celebrated Corisarat. In the forty's was included the discoveries of chloroform and ether. In the nineteenth century the first useful employment of the microscope in medicine occurred. In 1854 Davaine announced that splenic fever was caused by a germ or micro-organism. In 1879 Bonchard discovered the bacillus of typhoid fever. In 1882 Prof. Robert Koch discovered the bacillus of tuberculosis and also the cholera germ. Since then the so called X-rays by Roentgen enabling the physician to see what is within the human body has been discovered. The medical world has been investigating and reaching for a germicide or bactericide for the suppression of these various causes of disease. As regards tuberculosis, they commonly called consumption, they have been eminently successful and it is now positively known that consumption can be cured.
