WELLS, CONSTRUCTIONS.

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners, Adams County, Indiana.

We the undersigned viewers and engineer appointed by your honorable board at the January special term, 1901, and in pursuance to the within order of said appointment proceeded to lay out and straighten and assess damages of an improvement as prayed for in said petition would most respectfully submit the following report. ⑥

In pursuance to said order we John R. Peoples, James M. Willey, as viewers, and G. E. McLean as engineer met at the Auditor's office in the City of Decatur, Indiana, on the 1st day of February, 1901, and after being duly sworn as prescribed by law we proceeded to view examine, lay out and straighten said road as shown by that part of our report which exhibits shows a description of the route of the proposed road. Said exhibit is marked "A".

Also a profile showing the grade of the said road as established and showing the "cuts and fills" also locations of bridges and culverts, said profile is marked exhibit "B". The same being on file in the office of County Surveyor.

We further find that the construction of the proposed improvement in accordance with the plans and specifications herein set forth would be of public benefit and utility.

We further find no claims for damages of any kind whatever.

We further estimate the cost of the proposed improvement to be \$12,000.00.

Roadway, Grade, Etc.

The roadway must be clear of all fences, trees, stumps, logs and all other rubbish, of whatever nature it may be.

All stumps must be blasted or grubbed out either in the drains or on the grade.

The right-of-way shall be forty (40) feet in width.

At any time during the construction of the road, or grade on or before the final acceptance of the same, the grade should settle, the contractor shall fill all depressions caused by the settling thereof and restore the same to the grade indicated on the profile.

The side drains shall be cut to a depth of not less than eighteen (18) inches below the crown of the grade.

All side drains to be made fully outside of the grade.

All drains shall be constructed in a neat and workmanlike manner with sufficient fall and outlet that they may carry all the water that may accumulate therein and remove the same from the right-of-way.

The bottom of the drains to be unobstructed and continuous.

The roadbed shall be made in a smooth and workmanlike manner to be inspected and accepted by the superintending engineer of the road in 100 feet sections before any materials are placed thereon.

The superintending engineer and County Commissioners reserve the right to inspect the materials used and condemn the same if necessary; and all materials so condemned shall be removed from the right-of-way and not used at any time in the construction of the road.

All sewer-pipe bridge materials as is used in public improvements and are now among the line of the proposed improvement shall become the property of the township in which it is located except the sewer-ile at station 43 and station 60 plus 65 feet.

Cross-stones, land marks, etc., shall be reported by the contractor while making said improvements.

GENERAL STIPULATIONS.

It is expressly understood that the superintending engineer shall have the right to make any necessary changes when needed while the proposed improvement is under construction.

The superintending engineer and County Commissioners reserve the right to increase or diminish the labor or the amount of the materials used.

We further find that the construction of the proposed improvement in accordance with the plans and specifications herein set forth would be of public benefit and utility.

We further find no claims for damages of any kind whatever.

We further estimate the cost of the proposed improvement to be \$9000.00.

Roadway, Grade, Etc.

The roadway must be clear of all fences, trees, stumps, logs and all other rubbish, of whatever nature it may be.

All stumps must be blasted or grubbed out either in the drains or on the grade.

The right-of-way shall be forty (40) feet in width.

If at any time during the construction of the road, or grade, or on or before the final acceptance of the same, the grade should settle, the contractor shall fill all depressions caused by the settling thereof and restore the same to the grade indicated on the profile.

The grade shall be of the single track system, to be of a uniform width of twenty-eight (28) feet from shoulder to shoulder with a slope of three (3) inches from center to either side.

The side drains shall be cut to a depth of not less than eighteen (18) inches below the crown of the grade.

All side drains to be made outside of the grade.

All drains shall be constructed in a neat and workmanlike manner, with sufficient fall and outlet that they may carry all the water that may accumulate therein and remove the same from the right-of-way.

The bottom of the drains to be unobstructed and continuous.

The road bed shall be made in a smooth and workmanlike manner, to be inspected and accepted by the superintending engineer of the road in 1,000 feet sections before any materials are placed thereon.

Grade lines and stakes set by the engineer and destroyed through the negligence of the contractor will be set again at the contractor's expense.

CROSS STONE, KIND, ETC.

The crushed stone shall be placed upon the sub-grade or road bed to a width of twelve (12) feet and to a depth of ten (10) inches in the center and eight (8) inches at the sides, the coarser particles to be placed on the outer edge of the right-of-way and to be not nearer than one (1) foot from said right-of-way as laid out by the engineer.

GENERAL STIPULATIONS.

It is expressly understood that the contractor is not compelled to place in any tile, culvert, bridge, grade or approaches at any private land, lane, road, crossing, etc., fence, posts or similar matter, that may be within the limits of the right-of-way of the proposed improvement not removed by the party to whom they belong after having had sufficient notice then the contractor shall remove the same.

Also telephone companies owning, operating or maintaining any lines or poles or along the line of the proposed improvement shall remove them to the outer edge of the right-of-way and to be not nearer than one (1) foot on said right-of-way as laid out by the engineer.

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
