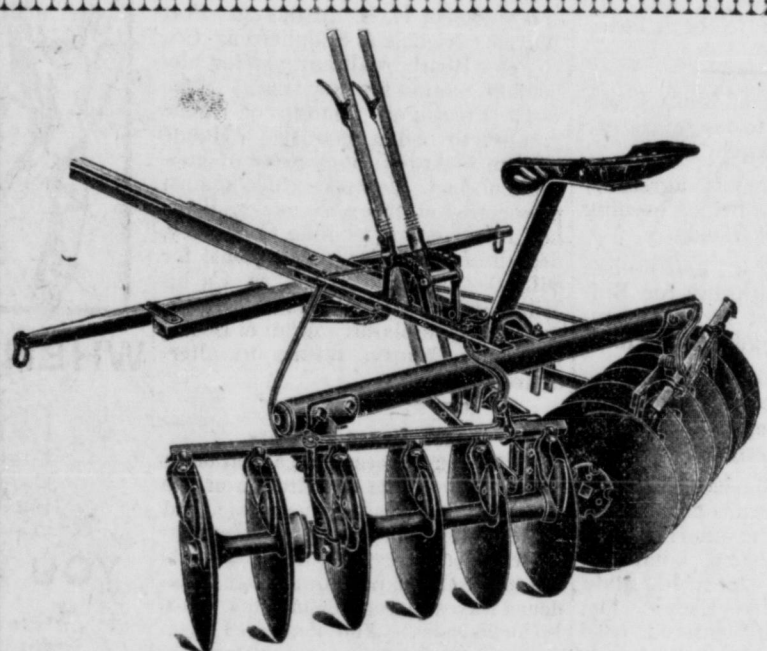

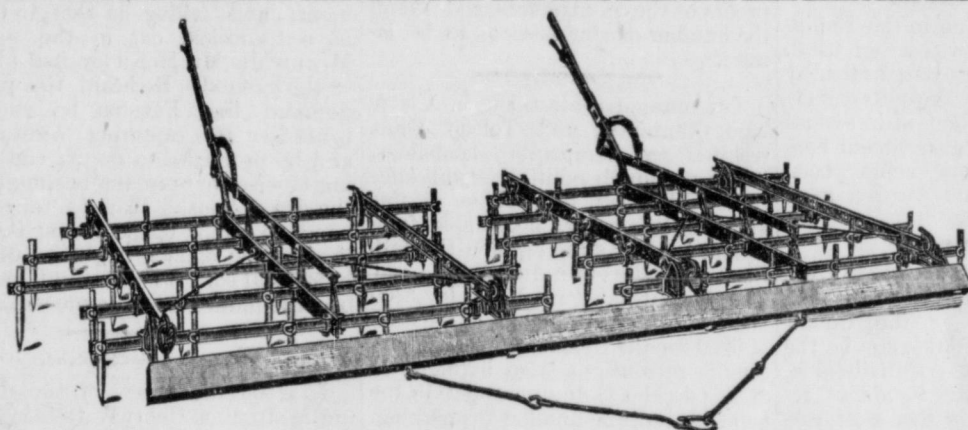
Imperial Spring Tooth Harrow.
