

## VOTING PRECINCTS.

As established and agreed upon by the Adams County Democratic Central Committee at its meeting on the 30th day of November, 1901, in the Democratic Primary Election to be held Friday, January 10, 1902, the following named places have been selected as polling precincts:

Union Township—One precinct at Hines postoffice.

Root Township—Two precincts, East Root at Aber school house, West Root in Monmouth.

Preble Township—Two precincts, North Preble at Friedheim, South Preble at school house north of the town of Preble.

Kirkland Township—One precinct, in school house number four south of Peterson.

Washington Township—One precinct, at Alex People's house, East side of railroad.

St. Mary's Township—Two precincts, North St. Mary's in the town of Bobo, South St. Mary's at Pleasant Mills.

Blue Creek Township—Two precincts, North Blue Creek at Steele, South Blue Creek in the Prairie school house.

Monroe Township—Three precincts North Monroe in Monroetown, East Monroe east of G. R. & I. railroad to corporation line, west to Jefferson street, then south to township line, West Monroe, west of G. R. & I. railroad to corporation line, and west of Jefferson street to township line.

French Township—One precinct, voting place at Election school house.

Hartford Township—Two precincts North Hartford in Lima Grove, South Hartford in the Brushwood school house.

Wabash Township—Three precincts, North at school house in district number two. East in east of the G. R. & I. railroad in Geneva, west in Calibooe, south part of town, west of G. R. & I. railroad Geneva.

Jefferson Township—Two precincts West at the Buckmaster school house, East at the Boomer school house.

Decatur Corporation—Three precincts, one in first ward in office at Vail's factory west of G. R. & I. railroad, in second ward, one precinct in north room of court house basement, in third ward, one precinct in Meyer's livery barn on Second street.

Such election shall be held in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Adams County Democratic Central Committee.

# NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

## TAXES FOR THE YEAR 1901.

Notice is hereby given that the taxes levied for the State, County, School and other purposes in Adams county, Indiana, are due and payable at the Treasurer's office of said county in the city of Decatur, in full or at option of the taxpayer, one-half, including road taxes in full on or before the first Monday in May, 1902, the same being

MONDAY, MAY 5, 1902.

The second half (in case the first half is paid when due) becomes due and payable on or before the first Monday in November, 1902, the same being

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 1902.

The following table shows the rate of taxation on each One Hundred Dollar's worth of property, and also on each Poll in the several Townships and Corporations in Adams county, Indiana, for the year 1901. When so much as one-half of the taxes charged to a taxpayer are not paid on or before the first Monday in May, the whole amount will become due and delinquent and the penalty attached.

## Road Tax Receipts

Should be presented on or before the first Monday in May, as the road tax is all included in the first installment. Road tax receipts will not be taken for second installment of taxes. Examine your receipts before leaving the office and see that all your property is described. Also see that change is correctly made.

## Particular Attention.

Those who have lands and lots or other property in more than one Township must see that they have a receipt for all. County Orders cannot be paid to any person owing delinquent taxes. All persons are warned against purchasing such orders. The Books will positively be closed on the First Monday in May and the First Monday in November.

Assignees, Guardians, Administrators and others who pay tax on property in trust; and persons whose taxes are complicated such as undivided estates, are earnestly requested to come before the last few days.

The taxes of the Wagoner, Decatur and Bluffton, East Washington, Decatur and Monroe, West Washington, Geneva, Ceylon and Wabash Township, and Joel Hirsch, Monroe Township Central, Pleasant Valley and Oak Grove, Peterson and Prairie, and West Jefferson Township Gravel Roads are now due and payable at this office, and are subject to the same penalties as other taxes if not paid.

The Municipal Taxes of the City of Decatur, and the towns of Berne and Geneva are payable at this office.

The Annual sale of Delinquent Lands and Lots will take place on the Second Monday in February, 1902, at 10 o'clock A. M.

## Corporation Dog Tax

There is levied \$2.00 on each male dog, and \$5.00 on each female dog in the City of Decatur, and \$1.00 on each male dog, and \$3.00 on each female dog in the town of Berne.

The Treasurer will not be responsible for penalties and charges on delinquent taxes resulting from any omission of the person paying such taxes to state definitely on what property, in whose name and what Township or Corporation it was assessed.

Call for property in name of owner April 1, 1901. The tax duplicates are made up on that day and never changed.

## Auditor's Special Notice

Parties having School Fund Loans on which interest is delinquent will please give the payment of said interest their attention before March 1, 1902, as the law requires the sale of the property mortgaged if the interest is not paid.
