PETITION FOR STONE ROAD.

Notice is hereby given that there has been filed in the Auditor's office, Adams county, a petition for the location and construction of a certain stone road, signed by more than fifty (50) freeholders and voters of Washington township, in said county, which petition is in the Auditor's office of said County, said roads to be built of crushed stone alone.

We, the undersigned, each and all of whom are resident freeholders and voters of Washington, and the incorporated city of Decatur, Adams county, Indiana, do hereby petition the Board of Commissioners of Adams county, Indiana, and having a population of less than 30,000 inhabitants, to cause the location and construction of a certain public highway already established, which said public highway is located as follows, to-wit:

PETITION FOR STONE ROAD.

Notice is hereby given that there has been filed in the Auditor's office, Adams county, a petition for the location and construction of a certain stone road, signed by more than fifty (50) freeholders and voters of Monroe township, in said county, which petition is in the following words, to-wit:

In the Commissioners' Court, May term, 1906.

Petition for extension of Macadamized Stone Road.

To the Honorable Board of Commissioners of Adams county, Indiana.

We, the undersigned resident freeholders and voters in Monroe township, Adams county, Indiana, do hereby petition your Honorable Board, that you proceed and take the necessary steps to have a free macadamized stone road built, completed and constructed in said township, over, on and upon the public highway located and situated in and upon the following described route, to-wit:

Commencing at a point on the Pleasant Valley and Oak Grove Macadam Road, at the south-east corner of section twenty-three (23), township thirteen (13) north, range fourteen (14) east, in Adams county, Indiana, thence to run west on, over and upon the public highway, the section line running east and west between sections twenty-three (23) and twenty-six (26), and sections twenty-two (22) and twenty-seven (27) in said township and range to the Monroe Central Macadam Road, the same being a free turnpike and stone road and to the south-west corner of the Monroe Central Macadam Road, township and range aforesaid, a distance of two miles, and there to terminate.

And we pray that you take such action upon this petition as you are authorized and directed to do, under and by virtue of an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, approved March 9, 1902, and under and by virtue of an Act of the General Assembly of said State, approved March 4, 1905, amending said Act.

We further ask that said improvement be paid for by bonds issued by said County of Adams, payable in twenty semi-annual payments for the payment of which bonds we ask that a tax be levied on the taxable property of said Monroe Township in said county, in the sum of \$100,000, and interest of said bonds as the same shall mature and become due and payable under and according to the provisions of said act of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, approved March 11, 1901, and any and all other amendments thereto, or any other law authorizing the levy of said taxes and the issuance of said bonds.

Your petitioners further represent that it will be cheapest and best to improve said highway by macadamizing the same with crushed rock as the same comes from the stone crusher and by placing upon the top of the same a coating of screenings, and your petitioners further ask that said improvement be so made that the road will admit of a double track, the same track improved with the crushed rock, the same track upon the west side of the highway, and the other side left duly graded for a dirt track.
