NONAGENARIAN IS DEAD.

Old Settler Tries to Reach 100, But Grim Reaper Wins.

Anderson, Ind., Oct. 13.—Jacob Webb, aged 99, died at his home near Frankton, yesterday, after a brief illness. It was the cherished ambition of the old pioneer that he live to reach the century mark. Until a few weeks ago his rugged constitution promised to sustain his ambition, but with illness, dissolution came rapidly. He was the oldest citizen of the county and was well known to all old settlers in the eastern part of the state. He is survived by four sons, Jacob, Isaac, Reno and John Webb, all living in Madison county.
