the Cripple Creek miners, advising
them to stand pat.

Taken to Allen County on Change
of Venue.

The evidence in the big Myer-
Glendening oil damage case was
concluded at noon today and argu-
ments began immediately after din-
ner, C. J. Lutz opening for the
plaintiff, followed by Frank Dailey
for the defense. Each side was
allowed three and a half hours and
the case will go to the jury at
about noon tomorrow.

The plaintiff in the case of
George E. McKean vs The city of
Decatur, asked for a change of
venue and the case was sent to
the superior court of Allen county
for trial.

probated in court today. He be-

shares to his ten children after fu-
neral expenses are paid. He ap-

Beeler as executors.
