Debs has joined the "stand paters," by sending a telegram to the Cripple Creek miners, advising them to stand pat.

According to schedule now arranged Senator Joe Bailey of Texas will be temporary chairman and representative John Sharpe Williams of Mississippi, permanent chairman of the St. Louis national convention.

Half a million dollars of the \$4,600,000 loaned to the St. Louis exposition by congress will be due June 15 and Mr. Shaw, secretary of the treasury, fears that the fair may prove a failure financially. If there is a default in any of the payments the law gives Mr. Shaw authority to take charge as a receiver and collect all the gate receipts until the government claim has been paid.

The evidence in the big Myer-Glendening oil damage case was concluded at noon today and arguments began immediately after dinner, C. J. Lutz opening for the plaintiff, followed by Frank Dailey for the defense. Each side was allowed three and a half hours and the case will go to the jury at about noon tomorrow.

The plaintiff in the case of George E. McKean vs The city of Decatur, asked for a change of venue and the case was sent to the superior court of Allen county for trial.
