A NEW SYSTEM

Inaugurated at the City Plant

M. J. Mylott Has Full Charge of Electric Department and W. E. Fulk of Water Station.

City Electrician Mylott this morning took full control of the electric light plant and Superintendent W. E. Fulk began similar duties in the water works department. As a result there is a real boss in each department for the first time since the city owned the plants. These men will be responsible for their respective department, will have the right to hire and discharge such help as they deem necessary, and must answer to the council for the condition of the plants at any time desired. This change in operating the plants is the result of a council meeting held Tuesday night when the following resolution was adopted:

"Be it Resolved, by the common council of the city of Decatur, Indiana, that the waterworks superintendent and the electric light superintendent shall have full control and management of their respective branches of the municipal plant of the said city with the right to hire and charge such employees as they see fit for the betterment of said waterworks and electric light plants of the said city; and that superintendents shall make their reports to the respective committees in conformity with the ordinances regulating the same; and any material needed for the maintenance of the plants shall be ordered by the purchasing committee at the request of the said superintendents and on the failure so to do by the purchasing committee, then the superintendent shall order the same to be paid for by the city; the same as if ordered by the purchasing committee of the said city; the said superintendents shall make an inventory of all tools and stock on hands every six months on and after September 1, 1905, and to make good to the city of Decatur, Indiana, all losses caused by negligence, in tools or material in their charge, and the same shall be deducted from the wages of said superintendent."

At the meeting some other business of importance was transacted. The plat for an addition to the city of Decatur for lands owned by Erwin and Archbold was spread of record. The resignation of Tom Baker as a fireman at the city station was accepted to take effect August 1st. The matter of a settlement of the new engine and dynamo was referred to the purchasing committee who were authorized by resolution to offer C. F. Johnson \$1059.43 as a settlement. A number of bills were allowed.
