Newspaper Decisions.

1. Subscribers who do not give express notice
to the contrary are considered wishing to continue
their subscriptions.

2. If subscribers order the discontinuance of
their periodicals the publishers may claim the
same until all arrears are paid.

3. If subscribers neglect or refuse to take their
periodicals from the office to which they are
delivered they will be responsible for all they have
paid and will be charged for their disappearance.

4. If subscribers move to other places without
informing the publishers, and the papers are sent
to their old address, the publishers will be responsible.

5. The courts have decided that "refusing to
take periodicals from the office or removing and
leaving them unclaimed, for prima facie evidence
of non-delivery." — See, *Alfred Thompson, Simon P. Thompson*.

6. Any person who receives a newspaper and
makes use of it, while it is still unclaimed or lost, or
if the subscriber is dead, the publisher will be responsible.

7. If subscribers pay in advance they are bound
to give notice to the publisher at the end of their
subscription, and the publisher is authorized to send
the same to the subscriber.
