NEWSPAPER DECISIONS.

1. Subscribers who do not give express notice to the contrary are considered wishing to continue to their subscription.

2. If subscribers neglect to renew their subscriptions, they will be discontinued.

3. If subscribers neglect or refuse to take their periodicals from the office to which they are directed, they will be discontinued.

4. If subscribers move to other places without giving the publisher notice, the publisher is sent to the former direction, they are discontinued.

The courts have decided that "refusing to take periodicals from the office or removing and not giving notice to the publisher is prima facie evidence of intent to fraud."

5. Any person who receives a newspaper and uses it, and then orders it discontinued, is ordered if not in held in law to be a subscriber.

7. If subscribers pay in advance they are bound to give notice to the publisher at the end of the periodicals, if they do not wish to be discontinued, otherwise the publisher is authorized to send it on and the subscribers will be responsible until an express notice with payment of all arrears is sent to the publisher.
