

Newspaper Decisions.

If subscribers who do not give express notice to the contrary are considered wishing to continue their subscription.

2. If subscribers order the discontinuance of their subscription, the same may continue to end until all arrears are paid.

3. If subscribers neglect or refuse to take their periodicals from the news-stands, until they have settled their bills and ordered them discontinued.

4. If subscribers move to other places without informing the publishers, and do not return to the former direction, they are held responsible.

5. The courts have decided that "refusing to take periodicals from the news-stand or returning them to the publishers for non-payment, is evidence of intentional fraud."

6. Any person who receives a newspaper and has no right to it, and either has ordered it or not, is held in law to be a subscriber.

7. If subscribers pay in advance, they are bound to give notice to the publishers, and end their subscription, if they do not wish to continue taking it; otherwise the publisher is authorized to sell it, and the subscribers will be responsible until an agreement is made with payment of all arrears is sent to the publisher.
