

**Newspaper Decisions.**  
1. Subscribers who do not give express notice to the contrary are considered willing to continue their subscription.  
2. If subscribers order the discontinuance of their paper, the publishers may continue to send them until all arrears are paid.  
3. If subscribers neglect or refuse to take their paper, the publishers may continue to send them, directed they are held responsible until they have settled their bills and ordered them discontinued.  
4. If subscribers move to other places without telling the publishers, and the publishers send to the former direction, they are held responsible.  
5. The courts have decided that "refusing to take back a paper the editor has sent to you, leaving them encased for permanent safe-keeping, is intentional fraud."  
6. Any person who receives a newspaper and makes no payment for it, has no right to it, or not, is held in law to be a subscriber.  
7. If subscribers pay in advance they are bound to take the paper at the end of their time, if they do not wish to continue taking it; otherwise the publisher is authorized to send it on to another, who will be responsible until an express notice, with payment of all arrears is sent to the publisher.
